Seacliff Surf Life Saving Club



The Seacliff Surf Lifesaving Club formed in 1930 and has a proud history in patrolling, instruction, competition and social activity for members. It provides a valuable service to the community with many rescues, first aid and support being provided throughout its long history

The Seacliff SLSC patrols the beaches from the point at Marino to Edward Street, Brighton, on weekends and public holidays between November and March.



We are affiliated with Surf Life Saving South Australia and our primary objective is to provide a safe, aquatic, leisure environment. Our main patrolling area is directly in front of Wheatland Street at Seacliff, where patrolling members keep watch and endeavour to prevent situations in which the public may be at risk.

Why join Seacliff SLSC?

Seacliff SLSC is one of SA's leading surf lifesaving clubs, with over 350 members of all ages.

Members have the opportunity to learn various life-saving skills, including surf safety, rescue techniques, resuscitation and first aid, which not only are vital as part of a surf lifesavers education, but invaluable life skills.

Members can compete in a diverse range of lifesaving events, with competition available at Junior, Senior/Open and Masters level. Competition not only includes traditional beach and water events, such as ironperson, flags, skis, boards and marchpast, but also more technical events such as Rescue & Resuscitation, First Aid & Champion Patrol.



Seacliff SLSC also has a large group of Junior members, with a Nippers program offered to children from 7 to 13 years of age. We also have a Tiny Tots program which is designed to introduce lifesaving to 5 and 6 year olds.

Club Facilities

Members have access to a range of club craft on which they can train, including skis, boards and surfboats, as well as a Gym, shower and change facilities.

The Seacliff clubrooms boast a large licensed social and entertainment area, which is serviced by a modern commercial style kitchen and a well stocked bar. A second bar overlooking the beach, offers a relaxed balcony setting with magnificent uninterrupted ocean views.

Meals are served at the club on Friday nights, with our full menu available from November to March and providing a great choice of great value home style meals for all the family and friends.
