**Seacliff Secures 2008-9 Junior State Titles**

It is with great excitement that I announce on behalf of Management, the 2008-9 Junior States will be hosted by us next March. The strength of our claim was as Sue Hicks observed, junior lifesaving at Seacliff has turned 40 seasons of age, and so the SA Board of Surf Sports voted for Seacliff. I flagged this at junior presentation and it is an opportunity to celebrate the fact that Seacliff started Nippers in SA and was extremely successful through the 70s, 80s and 90s and is rapidly becoming a force again.

From Gretta Haylock's book, "History of Swimming and Life-Saving at Seacliff 1930-1980" the founder and coach was Andy Higgs with assistants Darryl Starkey and legend Bob Evans in 1967-8. Vinnie Smyth coached from 1969-71.

This will be a starting point for junior reunions and to recognise all the past juniors, junior coaches, state reps, and committees for their contribution to not only Seacliff but to lifesaving in SA.

**Junior Open Day**

The 18<sup>th</sup> October will be the occasion that the new IRB, the "Pam Brooks" will be commissioned and blessed and all family and friends are invited to attend from 2 pm.

The "Pam" was funded in part by the Local and State Governments and so representatives have been invited for us to acknowledge their continued support. As selected by management, the final part of funding came from donations to the club on behalf of Pam and the IRB will be a highly visible, practical and a long lasting tribute.

**Please Note:** With the long weekend, the Club will not open on Friday 3rd October.

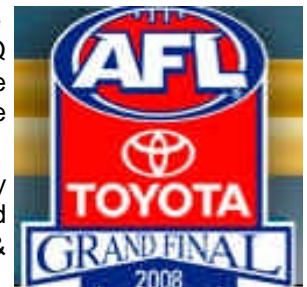
## AFL Grand Final Day

- water cover responsibilities during junior training, take priority over any other training commitments that you may have at this time. You must be available for the full duration of junior training in order to wear an orange cap
